RELIEF FROM ASPHALT PLANT ODOR

In response to the community's concerns about the Tidewater Asphalt plant, the Hoopa Valley Tribal Council will provide temporary relief to those living in the Campbell Field and Hostler/Matilton Districts who are affected by the inconvenient odor.

The Tribal Council has authorized continued operation of the plant through the week of October 28, with the strongest odors expected on Monday and Tuesday from 7:30am to 4:30pm. Operation of the plant will continue throughout the remainder of the week on a minimal basis, after which time, it is scheduled to close for the season.

Residents of the Campbell Field and Hostler/Matilton Districts who are affected are invited to a filtered air facility in Hoopa; **Monday at the Tsewenaldin Inn Conference Room and Tuesday through Friday at the Neighborhood Facilities Gymnasium from 7:30am to 4:30pm.**
